

## Learning at Work Week 2020 – Member survey


This is third year we have conducted an all-member learning survey across the East Midlands. Questions have remained similar, in order to chart changes, but specific questions regarding online learning have been added to identify how the Covid-19 pandemic has affect learning.

Despite the large take-up of learning throughout 2020 the numbers aware of free courses has decreased to 62% whilst only 18% of members are aware of UNISON Learning Grants.

There were 2576 responses.




**Did you know that UNISON had a programme of free courses for members?**


**Were you aware that UNISON offered grants for members who are paying for their own courses?**


**Did you know that UNISON has Union Learning Reps (ULRs) in many workplaces whose role is to support members around learning issues in the workplace?**

#### Crafts (Details)

47 simply stated 'any' although a large number also added 'to cope with stress/anxiety'. A number noted they would like skills to be able to use with service users whether that is children, vulnerable people, the elderly, or patients.



Comment – this question category has been added this year and includes a number of extra training options such as Management/Team Leading, which is the most popular request.

### **Learning Difficulties – Training needs**

We asked for specific details and received a wide variety of responses. Most simply said ‘all areas’, highlighting a huge appetite to understand the issues facing service users, family members and colleagues. Communication and understanding feature prominently. Some specific requests included; ADHD (9), Autism/Aspergers (9), Behaviours (9), Learning difficulties in Children and Young People for example speech delay and sensory issues (13), and Dyslexia (14)

Sample quotes

- “I work in Police custody and there are issues around detained persons capabilities”
- “there is no mandatory training for teaching staff in SEN ed so I, as an ex nurse /health visitor, find it difficult to work as an LSA with untrained teaching staff.”

### **Professional Qualifications – Training needs**

Of the 303 comments there were almost 303 different responses. The responses are varied and reflect all areas UNISON members work in. Social Work, Nursing, Higher Level Teaching Assistant are all noted. A number highlight Access courses in a number of subjects.

### **Working with Children – Training needs**

Across the comments a wide variety of issues were raised with sexualised behavior, safeguarding, anxiety and assertiveness most prominently noted.

### **Administration – Training needs**


Many noted the need for general skills which included IT (9 responses), Spreadsheets and databases (7 responses), budgeting, dealing with people, letter writing and note taking (14), and Typing (8)

### **Working in Care – Training needs**

Responses were similarly varied. Ranging from general to more specific requests such as Conflict Resolution and risk assessments

It would be worthwhile to survey sectors and job-roles to get more detailed findings.


**Learning is an essential element of Health and Wellbeing. Would you be interested in any of these courses to support you or to gain a better understanding?**


## What is your experience of learning online?


Comment – This question has been added as a result of a huge increase in online learning as a consequence of Covid-19. Whilst the vast majority are either used to online learning or have adapted well 12%, of those responding, are left out. Clearly an online survey will underestimate this number.


**What are the biggest barriers to you taking part in online learning? Tick all that apply**

Other - The greatest barrier noted is time with 311 responses and included work demands and caring responsibilities. 16 noted disability as a barrier and 22 stated cost. 17 identified IT issues acting as a barrier including old laptop, connectivity, no printer etc. Finally 54 stated that a lack of support from a tutor or that the lack of human contact was a barrier.


Comment – 156 members told us which courses they had done. Responses were incredibly varied and included courses run by the region, the TUC, the skills academy and by UNISON National office (LAOS).

- Regional courses (examples) – Basic Excel, Makaton, Functional Skills test, ADHD, Website Design, Careers, and Mindfulness
- Skills Academy Courses (examples) – Drug & Alcohol Awareness Certificate, Adult Safeguarding, Electrical Safety, Admin & PA Diploma, and Operations Management
- LAOS Organised courses (examples) – Dementia Awareness (OU), Cruse Bereavement Care, and Family Tree
- Various others – Nutrition & Health, Customer Service, Team Leader, Infection Control and Counselling Skills (all Leicester College). Various free courses with the Open University

A few provided some feedback:


- Intermediate Excel – “it was great!” and “Very good experience, professionally delivered and impressed that learning has moved on due to covid and continued, great stuff, thank you, have done some excellent learning during lockdown”
- Dealing With Difficult Telephone Calls Training – “Excellent Course”
- “I have completed 2 level 2 courses at Leicester College - they were both online - I found this gave me focus and something for myself during the lockdown”
- Working with Cancer. “It was extremely informative and very helpful”.
- Cruse course on bereavement. “Used zoom for first time ever. Tutor from London was excellent, as she guided us through really very emotional and sensitive subjects with professionalism, humour and humility. Helped me feel more confident to use zoom in a personal matter”.

**Would you be willing to request paid time-off work to attend training if it was relevant to your role or future roles?**





**If you were unable to get time-off would you be prepared to take annual leave?**




