An online learning site with free courses provided by top Universities and Specialist organisations. 100's of topics including business & management, literature, healthcare, programming & much more. Courses are usually just a few weeks long and only a few hours a week.

The home of free learning from the Open University. Not just courses, there are articles, videos, games and much more. Anybody can study with 900+ courses between 1–100 hours long. Science, maths, languages, healthcare etc.

The TUC's Education site has lots of short 'e-notes' for you to try. From Menopause in the Workplace to Understanding Universal Credit.



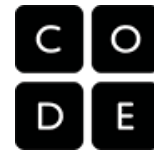

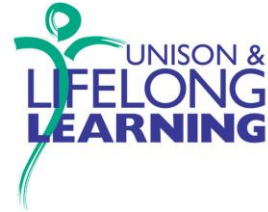
