
## Autism awareness when working with adults

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## Lone working awareness



This course is aimed at members who are required to work alone or visit service users or clients at their homes or other locations outside of the office.

This virtual course will increase your understanding of the risks associated with lone working and the key legislation that relates to this, including responsibilities of employers and employees.

You will learn how to plan visits to reduce personal safety risks, how to complete dynamic risk assessments and how to deal with potentially aggressive situations. It will be delivered via Zoom by an experienced specialist tutor.

- Risk assess lone working situations
- Interpret body language and be more aware of the signals that you are projecting
- Use practical techniques to manage aggressive situations

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## EXCEL IF function workshop



Out of all the Excel functions, the IF function is probably the most useful. It lets us tell Excel to look for a condition and perform one action if it is true or another action if it is false. The IF Function doesn't stop there, though - it will also let you count only those items in a list that meet your criteria, or let you define several criteria that can be either dependent or mutually exclusive.
